In August we were delighted that Aisha was selected to represent the Rwanda Rugby Federation in the Grassroots to Global forum that was held in Sunderland in the UK. Aisha worked very hard beforehand attending online seminars and meetings and made a presentation at the forum about women's rugby and the growth of rugby in Rwanda. Aisha also attended the opening ceremony and first match of the Women's Rugby World Cup, she took part in wheelchair rugby and played T1 rugby on the beach – what a wonderful experience and no doubt she has made new friends for life.









The Schools Sports Association in Rwanda organises rugby competitions every year. Although FoRR is not directly involved with this it is notable that the schools that do well often have a FoRR RDO working with them. This year one of Emmanuel's schools was the girls' school champions and one of Joseph's schools was the boys' champions.

Joseph travelled to Kenya with the boys' team to represent Rwanda in the East African schools' finals. Well done to both RDOs and their teams.

Our RDOs have been running Rugby y'Abana Bato sessions with children from 3-6 years for a few years now but it is only this year that, with funding from the Jane and Dennis Reese Foundation coordinated by AJ Hale, we have been able to run trainings for nursery teachers and caregivers at ECD centres and schools. In September Kamanda, Aiha and Babou ran a training for 12 nursery teachers from Rubavu district. The feedback was excellent- well done team!










